Updates from Project Groups:

IPCC Group Review

- 1. Project 1| IPCC group review: Group review of the Second draft of Working Group I contribution to IPCC Sixth Assessment Report (SOD-WGI-AR6)
 - a. May 15: End of the group review process.
 - b. May 15 June 3: Sorting of the reviewer's comments by chairs
 - c. June 4: Comment file submitted to the IPCC à As a group, we submitted 2173 comments on Chapters 2, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 of the SOD-WGI-AR6
 - d. June 9: "Formal farewell" to participants & survey sent
- 2. What happens next?
 - a. We will send all reviewers and organizers a certificate of participation.
 - b. When the IPCC report is published (expected in 2021):
 - Experts reviewers will be recognized for their contribution with their name, affiliation, and country of residence being published in the Annex of Reviewers of the WGI report.
 - ii. All the submitted comments and the authors' answers will be publicly available.
- 3. Project 2| IPCC group review: Group review of the Second draft of Working Group II contribution to IPCC Sixth Assessment Report (SOD-WGII-AR6)
 - a. Call for applications was initially published on 31 March, but we had to temporarily pause applications since the IPCC has modified the date of the WGII - AR6 expert review of the SOD (the new date is 4 Dec 2020 -29 Jan 2021).
 - b. Team members will be contacted at the end of July to see if they are still available to participate in the organization of the review.

c. A new call will be published in August (if the IPCC doesn't change the timeline).

INTERACT communication and navigation guidebook

- 1. PG is up and running
- 2. Next meeting on June 16, we aim for approx. monthly meetings from now on
- 3. We have a rough outline for the book and start distributing the chapters for literature review and writing
- 4. We aim to make a survey for station leaders to find out their specific needs, this summer with limited fieldwork will be good for this

Polar Organisations Overview PG

- 1. Set up a private FB group for our PG members for easier communication
- 2. Updating of the Database is on hold until the proposed changes from last year's PG are fully implemented on the Website (we are in contact with Gerlis and the APECS office about this matter)

T-MOSAiC Project Group

- T-MOSAiC project has been prolonged till December 2021 (the decision was accepted by IASC during ASSW2020 meeting). The current situation with COVID also forced us to alter our activities which were planned in tight connection with field season 2020 (especially our T-MOSAiC Vlogs initiative), since most of the expeditions were postponed/canceled.
- 2. We tried to organize a special "T-MOSAiC" session at the APECS Online Conference. Although no special session was organized (due to time constraints), 5 ECRs from T-MOSAiC presented their works at the conference. The idea of "T-MOSAiC" session, however, remains actual for next year's conference.

March Polar Week 2020

- 1. The polar week was held on 15th-21st March (online). The activities were:
 - a. a polar photo contest
 - b. a scientist-who-selfie challenge
 - c. a drawing challenge (https://www.apecs.is/outreach-archive/polar-weeks-archive/polar-weeks-archive/polar-week-2020/polar-week-march-2020-kids-artwork/category/13.html)
 - d. a quiz (every day a new quiz)

- e. a fun fact edition (every day a new fun fact)
- f. a polar movies/podcast selection
- g. an indigenous collaboration poster

APECS Online Conference

- 1. It was successfully held in May with ca. 50 presenters and over 500 attendees distributed all around the world.
- 2. Now in the process of writing up the PG final report.

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in Polar Research (DEI)

- Led a collaborative webinar on working with indigenous communities with the Indigenous Collaborations project group. The video of that webinar can be seen here and the post-webinar discussion can be seen here.
- 2. Collaborated on a proposal for a town hall meeting on diversity in polar science at the American Geophysical Union annual meeting. That proposal can be seen here.
- 3. Presented on polar inclusive codes of conduct at the IASC/IASSA Gender in Polar Research workshop. A summary of that event can be found here.
- Wrote, edited, and submitted for expert review a thorough code of conduct and bill of rights for polar fieldwork. Those documents can be seen here and will be posted on the APECS website soon.
- 5. Had ongoing conversations with ExCom about social media posts in support of the Black Lives Matter movement including organizing a "twitter takeover" by Minorities in Polar Research. This led to the expedited release of the APECS twitter post on the Black Lives Matter movement which can be seen here. This discussion will continue to make sure that ExCom pursues substantive efforts to promote black voices within polar science.
- 6. Participated in ongoing discussions with IARPC and IASC about releasing statements in support of the Black Lives Matter movement.
- 7. Initial planning for another webinar about being a better ally or on being a mother in polar science.

Mentorship Award (MA)

- 1. We have discussed with the Directorate how to progress with this year's edition, as last year MA has not been awarded;
- 2. Following the suggestion of Gerlis, we collectively decided to first deal with MA2019, simultaneously opening MA2020 call for applications;
- 3. With the exception of one member (Juan, our ExCom contacted has been notified and already took an action; cced), everyone else has submitted their reviews in a timely manner, so we should be able to award MA2019 fairly soon;

- 4. Deadline for submitting MA2020 applications is in two days (June 21st), thus we should be able to finish reviews by the end of July;
- 5. We decided to announce the winners of MA2019 and 2020 simultaneously, later in the summer.

APECS SCAR2020 Workshop

Progress:

- 1. SCAR2020 in Hobart canceled due to COVID-19. APECS SCAR2020 Workshop has been moved to an online workshop
- 2. Workshop planned to be run between 11-13th August (the week after the when SCAR OSC online sessions are planned)
