  - a. Josefine Lenz is the new Interim Executive Director. The directorate thanked everyone for patience and support during the handover. Josefine has been involved in APECS Germany a lot, and been involved in several EU projects. Also she led the MOSAiC School 2019. Studies permafrost, based in Potsdam.
  - b. Andrea and Lisa will leave the APECS Directorate in November, EU projects will hopefully allow us to increase capacity early 2021
  - c. The main task now for the Directorate is to find a new host for APECS (it has been AWI until the end of 2021).

  - ii. Chile: organized quite a few activities. Involved in Antarctica day.
  - iii. Luxembourg: during the last six months it has been complicated to perform the planned school activities. Postponed to next year.

- iv. *Denmark*: started up this year. Tricky with in-person activities. Had some online activities and recruiting members at the moment via a new website etc.
- v. Germany: in-person film festival during polar week. Collaborating with the society for polar research in Germany. Creativity competition graduate students running at the moment.
- vi. *UK*: very recently switched leadership. Involved in several online conferences and in several PGs. Planning of school activities. Join activities with APECS Russia.
- vii. APECS Colombia: Jhon Mojica talked about APECS Colombia participation in an Education Conference, the "VIII Encuentro de Investigaciones de la Facultad de Ciencias y Educación", which was held online in Bogotá (Colombia) by the "Universidad Distrital Francisco José de Caldas" in October 26-30, 2020. As part of this Conference, they presented a talk and submitted a short manuscript about updates of APECS Colombia, which will be part of the Memories Book. Additionally, Jhon mentioned that they conducted a call to receive some articles about Antarctic women-in science for the "Revista Digital Fulica", since the idea is preparing an article to publish in February within the framework of "Women's day in science". Dalia Barragán, also suggested that it's a good idea to conduct specific activities from APECS to celebrate the "Women's day in science" in February 2021.
- viii. *France*: polar week in spring (students 6-10 years). Next one next week with almost 10 ECS speakers.
- ix. *Spain*: planning an online conference for Antarctica day to get to know each other. Created a WhatsApp group for communication.
- x. Brasil: We have been doing online webinars once a month. Last week we closed the international polar week with the participation of more than 30 schools. And now we are planning the Antarctica's Day. One of the activities will be a live with integrants from the Brazilian Antarctic station. And next year, we will have our symposium on polar research, and next month we will publish our next semi annual newsletter describing brasilian researches and our activities.
