NC's update:

Project Group Progress Updates:

Project Group

Antarctica Day: Jilda filled in information on this group: can't give much details yet but emails went out and NCs organized events. NCs are asked to submit reports on hat they've done to Gerlis, sending photos of the event, date and any useful information to be included on APECS website.

Congratulations to Bruno APECS Peru for their video to celebrate Antarctica Day and the launch of its new NC.

Alpine Cryosphere: Alice: different group as Merran (coordinator) is the only Council member in the group. Have recruited volunteers and they are going through existing resources so not to duplicate, will start a webinar series of what to expect when doing field work. They have lots of ideas and are looking to work with partners experts in alpine

environments

Arctic Frontiers 2017 - Science for Schools / Politics & Communications Panel & Poster Awards: Sara on Science for Schools: this is a side event from the Conference in Tromso, a 3-day session. Inviting schools near Tromso to participate and will engage the students with speakers of Polar Sciences. Students will create science posters that will be judged by scientists. There is also the Nansen award for conference posters.

APECS Report 2008-2016: Gerlis: ExComm working on a draft to be finalised before Xmas break, has to be submitted by the end of January 2017 as it is the report for APECS directorate funding.

APECS Workshop at Arctic Science Summit Week (ASSW) 2017: Igor: on 2 April 2017 there will be 2 panels in the morning: working with international organizations and collaborations with indigenous communitie, and break out groups. APECS Workshop at International Arctic Social Sciences (ICASS) 2017: Gesche: group is gathering ideas at the moment and deciding on the topic. The workshop date is 7 June 2017

APECS Workshop at SCAR Biology Symposium: Igor: organizing a workshop probably before symposium starts on 10 July, waiting to hear from potential participants

APECS Social Event at the European Geophysical Union (EGU): Gerlis: we don't have a volunteer at the moment, if anyone is willing to put their hand up please let us know. Otherwise we will take it off the group projects list.

Education & Outreach Strategies: Gerlis: not much from this group yet as it is about to get started.

IASC Fellowships 2017 Review: Gerlis: the review is completed, currently waiting to hear back from IASC. Cannot comment any further as there are applicants for this position in this call.

International Online Conference 2017: Lorna: very excited with the results of the meetings. The theme is 'Outside the box', short 10 min presentations welcoming alternative ideas, different methodologies, application of problem solving, anything that is different. Will be open

to APECS and non-APECS members, looking for volunteers (i.e. chairing, IT solutions). Date will be for start of Polar week (20 March). Open to ideas and suggestions of potential speakers. It has its own logo for advertising. The webpage will go live today, hopefully.

Madrid Protocol Celebrations: Gary: it's a small group, some from PEI too. Soon, in the process of writing an article to be available by beginning of January, and to have a team to write the school curriculum to go with it.

Mentorship Award: Jennifer: the application/nomination process for this award has changed, requesting only 2 letters of recommendation, changing in the nomination date deadlines so they don't clash with polar field work.

Non-Academic Careers: Jilda: working on an action plan, looking at what has been done and not duplicating. Reaching for potential mentors, looking at using resources that are already available within APECS website, creating a Q&A section on the website for non-academics. Will touch base with group in the new year.

Polar Match: Garry: this is a PEi project too, matching educators with researchers that are willing to make an appearance at a school (can be virtually) and be linked with the educators.

Polar Weeks: Alex: the first meeting will be end of Dec-beginning of Jan, looking for ideas so please email the leaders: for March 2017, Jean Holloway, and we are looking for someone for September 2017.

Social Media Group 2016/17: Marta: brainstorming how to communicate more efficiently information and to promote events. Asking for people to contact them with any information, they would like to produce a weekly update. Please email to social-media@apecs.is

Summary of Polar Organizations: Gabriela: group had at attempt of meeting before Gabriela left for Antarctica, first meeting likely to be in early January for the response obtained so far. time, next meeting will be early next year.
